Labour Force Statistics of Northern and Eastern Provinces - 2002

Introduction:

In the recent past the Department of Census & Statistics was unable to conduct Household Surveys in the areas under the Northern and the Eastern Provinces due to the unavailability of a proper sampling frame. (A proper sampling frame should consist of the list of all housing units and other units in the area concerned).

A listing of units was carried out also in the Northern and the Eastern Provinces prior to the Census of Population and Housing 2001 and these listings are available for sampling purposes for the following geographical domains.

Domains used for sampling purposes.

1) Eastern Province -

Lists of units are available in all the 3 Districts Ampara, Trincomalee and Batticaloa except for few G.N.Divisions.

2) Northern Province_ -

The lists of units which could be used for sample selection purposes are generally available (except for few isolated G.N.Divisions)

- (i) in all of the D.S.Divsions in Jaffna District **except for Thenamarachchy D.S.Division**,
- (ii) in all of the D.S.Divisions in Vavuniya District except for Vavuniya North **D.S.Division** and
- (iii) in "Mannar Town" D.S.Divisionr **2002. only but not in other 4 D.S.Divisions** in Mannar District.

Further no lists of units are available for Killinochchi and Mullaitivu Districts at all.

Survey Operation in the North and the East:

The Sample Surveys Division of the Department of Census & Statistics decided to commence household sample survey programme in the North and the East, using the above partially complete frame as a beginning. A sample which is adequate to provide estimates of basic labour force characteristics for the geographical domains described earlier was used in the Labour Force Survey conducted in the North and the East in year 2002. **The results given in this bulletin refers to these geographical domains** and the results are based on the total sample covered in year 2002. In the tables these geographical domains are referred to as (1) Northern (Part) and (2) Eastern respectively.

Limitations of Data:

Due to the sampling frame limitations described earlier in this bulletin, it was also decided not to publish total estimates, but to publish proportions and rates only in this bulletin. Action has already been taken to rectify the problems in the existing frame and it is hoped that household sample surveys could be conducted covering all the districts in Sri Lanka, (including the North and the East) based on a proper sampling frame commencing fourth quarter of year 2003.



- The male participation rate in the labour force is about three times that of the female participation rate in the area of the Northern province covered in the survey. The same pattern can be observed in the Eastern province also.
- The reported unemployment rate is above the national average (which is around 9 percent) in both areas. Eastern province has reported a even higher rate as compared with the Northern province.
- The female unemployment rate is markedly higher compared with the male unemployment rate in both provinces. Female unemployment rate is more than 4 times as that of the rate for males.
- The highest labour force participation can be observed in the age groups 25 29 in both provinces. It is nearly fifty five percent for both sexes.
- The highest unemployment rate is reported in the age group 15 19 in both provinces and it is nearly 42 percent.

• Nearly 75 percent and 65 percent of the employed persons in the Eastern and the Northern province respectively, have a level of education below G.C.E.(O/L) only.

GCE (A.L)/HNCE & above

• Table 4 reveals that, the proprtion of employed females with G.C.E.(A/L) & above is higher than that of males. This difference is more prominent in the Northern areas covered in the survey as compared to East.

- The proportion of Unpaid family workers in the Northern and the Eastern provinces is quite below the proportion generally reported in the other parts of the country, which is around 10 part.
- As in other parts of the country the highest proportion of the employed person is reported in agricultural sector in both provinces. It is nearly 39 percent in both provinces.
- The involvement of females in agricultural activities as an employment is less as compared with their male counterparts, particularly in the Eastern province. However with respect to other industrial categories, involvement of employed females in the Northen province is lower as compared with the East, except for the industrial category 'Education'.


